






Metrics for Analysis


For each of the six questions below, we graphed:

- 1. All responses
- 2. Responses by race
 - People of color vs. white only (white includes respondents who selected only white, only Jewish and white, only Jewish, or indicated European ancestry)
 - 82 respondents did not indicate race and are not included in this analysis
- 3. Responses by neighborhood
 - High priority vs. low priority neighborhoods
 - High priority = Charles, Elmwood, Federal Hill, Hartford, Lower South Providence, Manton, Olneyville, Reservoir, Silver Lake, Smith Hill, Upper South Providence, Valley, Wanskuck, Washington Park, West End
 - Low priority = Blackstone, College Hill, Downtown, Elmhurst, Fox Point, Hope (Summit), Mount Hope, Mount Pleasant, South Elmwood, Wayland
 - 119 respondents did not indicate neighborhood and are not included in this analysis
- 4. Responses by housing status
 - Rented vs. owned vs. dorm
 - 120 respondents did not indicate housing status and are not included in this analysis


